# The Tri-City Tappers: Never too old to be a showgirl!

Tappers' spring show, 'Viva Las Vegas,' will feature dancers and guest performers

Former Las Vegas showgirl Kim Stock is celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Tri-City Tappers with a gala musical revue. "Viva Las Vegas" will be held at the Hanford High School Auditorium on June 14, with a matinee at 2 p.m. and an evening show at 7.

Thirty-three beautiful showgirls (all over 40) will be the stars of the show, with special guests Steve Haberman and Mary Lou Gnoza. Bryan Foley wil appear as Frank Sinatra, Paul Davis as Dean Martin and Scott Miller as Elvis. Beautiful costumes, great music and lots of tap dancing will make this a memorable show for fans of music and dance.

The Tri-City Tappers was founded in 1994 specifically for women performers over the age of 50. The group became so popular that Stock decided to open it up to younger women who had asked to join, and it became an over-40 dance troupe.

The group performs year-round at retirement and assisted-living homes, service-club meetings and dance competitions. Performing is not mandatory, but that's the fun of

belonging.

You can book the group to entertain at your party, luncheon, banquet or other event. The shows last 30-45 minutes and are warmly received by

audiences of all ages.

Stock, the Tri-City Tappers instructor, leader, mentor and cheerleader, has danced professionally for 25 years, nationally and internationally as well as in shows in Las Vegas. She has been teaching for 22 years and owned a dance studio in California before coming to the Tri-Cities.

Classes for beginners are held twice a year, and the beginners to the Tri-City Tappers are called Silk Stockings. You need not have previous dance experience. It's great physical exercise and great social interaction, so if you're interested, visit the Tappers online and get started as a Silk Stocking!





#### Kim Stock, Tri-City Tappers Dance Director and Choreographer.

Kim began dancing at 4 and turned professional at 16 as a chorus girl in her native Miami. She worked in several national and international production over a 25year period. Five of those were at many of the major hotels in Las Vegas as assistant choreographer and lead dancer. For 4 years, Kim owned and operated a dance studio in California for 4 years. In our local area, she choreographed Stepping Out for the Richland Players and 42nd Street for Richland Light Opera Company. Kim has been teaching for the last 22 years, and at age 71, is aging gracefully. She is married to Edward Stock, 63, a nuclear engineer with 30-plus years in the industry. Ed hales from Temperance, Mich. He met Kim in New Orleans; Salena, his daughter, lives in Sarasota, Fla. Kim and Ed traveled the country for several years and now call the Tri-Cities their home.



Mary Lou Gnoza. Vocal stylist Mary Lou is well known to audiences in the Pacific Northwest for her dazzling repertoire of show-stopping Broadway songs, jazz standards, show and dreamy ballads and blues. 




