TOLEDO — The official cause of death for Martin J. (Marty) Burgard, 42, of 3330 E. Erie Rd., Erie, Monday afternoon in Toledo Hospital was a pulmonary embolus (blood clot on the lung), Lucas County coroner Dr. James Patrick ruled Wednesday.

Mr. Burgard died of com-plications from a knee injury suffered on Oct. 27, Dr. Patrick said. A blood clot is a fairly common cause of death follow-ing an injury to the lower extremities of the body, he said.

He was a life member of St. Joseph Church and was secre-tary of the parish council. He was a special minister of the Eucharist of the parish and was active in Marriage Encounter. He was a member of Council 7413, K of C, and United Auto Workers Local 12, Toledo.
