Carleton and Air-port teams had appeared in district finals seven times previously, always winding up on the short end of the score.

Coach Sindlord's erew upset Dundee, host team and tournament favorite with a 14-1 regular season mark, in the opening game despite losing to the Vikings earlier. Then blg Allen rained in 26 points when the Jets took the finals from Milan. In midition the victory came in

the school's first year in Class B. Plited against 100 much sayvy and shooting ability in the regionals. Airport dropped a one-sided decision to Livonia Bentley.

The Jets were besten only twice on their home boards, while winning 3 and losing 5 regular senson road encounters. Airport will be a member of the Southeastern Michigan Conference this fall and they took 3 of 5 starts against; league clubs this year, beating circuit champion Hillsdale.
