Airport Scores Win in Opener

*Ron Hatcher Hurls Jets to 7-5 Victory

BELLEVILLE — All-around Ron Hatcher weathered a three-run Belleville rally despite a growing sore arm here Wednesday as he pitched Airport's Jets to an opening game victory over the Tigers, 7-5.

The game originally was scheduled for the Carleton diamond but transferred here because of wet grounds. The Jets remained the home team.

Coach Bill Leech's club, which opens its Southeastern Michigan Conference schedule against Tecumseh today, belted a pair of Belleville hurlers for seven runs and six hits to take a commanding, 7-2 lead going into the final stanza.

*Hatcher, whose arm bothered him more and more as the game progressed, dished up a two-run triple to Danaezgn and the same player scored on an error to make it 7-5. After that, not a man reached base.

Airport's big inning was the sixth when a walk to Ken Phifer, Ray Doede's single, an error and Ron Breitner's two-run one-baser produced three tallies. They proved to be decisive.

Breitner and Jabe each had two safeties for the winners with Belleville's seven blows spread among as many players.

Breitner Hurls One-Hitter. As Jets Win Third Straight

CARLETON — Junior Ron Breitner, cleanup man in the Airport lineup, turned his talents to pitching here Monday and paced the Jets to a 3-2 victory over stubborn Huron Township. It was the third straight triumph for Coach Bill Leech's aggregation.

Breitner and Huron's Suemlich locked up in a first class pitcher's duel, each hurler giving up only one hit. First baseman Tossi wrecked the Jet no-hit bid with a bunt single in the fourth inning, but Airport made its lone safety much more devastating.

A walk to Doug Ramsey set the stage for Breitner in the opening frame. He blasted the ball high and deep to center field as both he and Ramsey circled the bases.

What proved to be the winning run was the result of Ron Hatcher's adept base-running. He got on with a base on balls, stole second, took third on an error and stole home.

Both Huron runs were unearned, although Tossi's scratch single figured in a lone fourth inning tally. The left-handed first sacker dragged one between first and second base to spoil Breitner's effort.

Coach Leech now has used three hurlers in as many games and none has allowed more than five runs. Breitner displayed a good fast ball in striking out 14 but he walked four and hit two batters. Suemlich had 10 strikeouts and is the best hurler faced by the Jets this year.

A three-run homer by Hatcher sparked Airport's 8-2 triumph over Tecumseh Friday. Details of the contest were not reported until Monday night.

Roger Hoog stopped the Indians

on five hits, getting 10 batters via the strikeout route. John Jabe joined Hatcher in run-producing with a two-tally single.

Tecumseh is the defending South-eastern Michigan Conference titleholder.

Bedford Mules End Airport Win Streak

LAMBERTVILLE—Bedford Rural Ag and Airport Community, a pair of Southeastern Michigan Conference baseball powers, locked horns in a wild game here Thursday with the Mules taking a 10-7 victory.

Going into the battle, the teams had lost an aggregate of only one game—Bedford's defeat at the hands of Class A Monroe. But neither displayed the form that had carried them to seven victories, many in well-played, low-scoring tilts.

The contest originally was scheduled for the Carleton diamond but wet grounds there necessitated a shift.

Roger Hoog's wildness and several bloop singles allowed the Mules to overcome a five-run deficit in the bottom of the sixth inning. Coach Marvin Bergman's club scored eight times in the frame.

The Jets tallied seven runs off the usually-tough Mel Knaggs and it looked like a routine triumph into the fatal sixth.

Dick Williamson opened with a double and scored on Ron Boehme's single. A hit batsman and Gary Douge's pop fly single loaded the bases before Hoog walked Clayton

HILLSDALE — Airport's high-flying Jets stayed in the thick of the Southeastern Michigan Conference baseball race here Tuesday with a 7-4 victory over winless Hillsdale.

Coach Bill Leech's club now has a 2-1 mark in league play and a 4-1 overall record, but the Jets needed fine relief work from Roger Hoog for Tuesday's triumph.

Airport scored four runs in the first inning only to have their advantage slashed to a single tally when the Hornets were done battling in the fifth frame.

Starter-winner Ron Hatcher walked the leadoff man in the Hillsdale sixth and Coach Leech promptly brought Hoog in from third base. The runner, Bob White, was thrown out on a foolish attempt to steal third before Hoog retired five straight batters, four of them on third strikes.

Ron Breitner and Doug Ramsey were the key men in the Jet offense, both singling home a pair of runs in the opening frame. An error and two walks set the stage for Breitner's blow into right field with Ramsey's sock to the same spot accounting for the final two tallies of the inning.

Ace Bill Moyer replaced starter Phil Johnson in the second inning

and he faced only 10 men in the next three stanzas.

Moyer tired in the later frames and was tagged for the only extra-base hits of the game in the seventh inning. Hatcher doubled and Breitner tripled him home.

The Jets are in action again today, meeting strong Flat Rock on the Carleton diamond.

Falcons Edge Airport, 4-3 For 6th Win

Catholic Central and Airport Community continued their red-hot baseball rivalry Monday at Cairns Field, the clubs battling through 10 tense innings before the Falcons eked out a 4-3 victory.

It marked the sixth straight triumph for Coach Jack Castignola's parochials and their second in Southeastern Michigan Conference competition. It also ended a string of one-run losses to the Jets.

Airport and Central have met seven times in the last four seasons and Monday's thriller was the sixth to be decided by one run. The seventh game was a 4-2 Falcon win in the 1953 season opener. The Catholics are 3-4 over the span.

The series also includes two other overtime struggles — an 11-inning affair in 1952 and a 10-inning battle last year.

LaBeau Connects

Central's Dick Vigliotti, who had a great football night against the Jets but turned in two of his worst edge performances against Airport, was most of the show in Monday's game.

He scattered four hits and posted 17 strikeouts with all of the visitors' tallies unearned. But it took a clutch blow by scrappy Jim (Red) LaBeau to prevent a 3-1 Central loss in regulation time.

The Jets used a pair of fine hurlers in Roger Hoog and Ron Breitner and Coach Bill Leech dipped deep into his bag of tricks for straggle but successful maneuvers.

14 Bases Stolen

Vigliotti had a large hand in the winning run when his alert base-running and a Jet error sent the crowd home around 7 p.m.

The threat of a tie game hung heavy as the Falcon hurler spiked a solid single to center field to open the 10th stanza. He stole second for the 14th pilfered base of the contest.

Don May dumped a sacrifice bunt toward the pitcher's box and when Breitner threw low to first base May was safe. The ball rolled a short distance away from Hoog, now playing first, and Vigliotti never hesitated.

Hurlers Start Fast

He wheeled around third and beat the throw home by an eyelash to keep the Falcons undefeated.

The game started as a real pitcher's duel. Hoog fanned seven of the first nine men he faced and failed to allow a hit until Rudy Kominek dropped a bloop into right-center field in the fourth inning.

The first hit off Vigliotti was Clarence Frankhouse's bunt single with two out in the third frame.

Central broke the scoring ice in the fourth stanza. Co-Captain John Kehres was hit by a pitched ball with one out and stole second. He went to third on catcher John Jabe's wild throw and scored on Kominek's bloop.

Errors Hurt Falcons

It was earlier in the same inning that Coach Leech pulled his center-fielder into the infield to guard against a possible squeeze play. He used the same defense with the bases loaded in the eighth frame and it worked both times. Central batters swung away and popped out.

All three Falcon errors were committed in the fifth inning and they gave the Jets three runs on a lone hit. George Mell walked to open the frame and little Ray Doede pushed a soft liner into center for a single.

Boof Helps Jets

Hoog bunted and when Kehres' throw pulled Cliff Dandron off first base the sacks were jammed with none out.

Then Don Lessner threw low to the plate on Frankhouse's roller and the score was tied. Vigliotti turned on the heat to fan Ron Hatcher, and Breitner bunted into a force play at the plate.

But Dandron let Bennie Meyer's fast grounder go through his legs and the Jets had a 3-1 lead. The way Hoog was pitching it looked good.

Hit and Run Clicks

The junior fast-baller may have been tiring in the sixth frame as he issued his first base on balls to Lessner. Kominek singled to shortstop on the hit and run but Vigliotti popped up for the second out.

May walked on a 3-2 pitch and LaBeau promptly put the ball into centerfield for a two-run single.

The Falcons had men on in the 7th, 8th and 9th frames but it took Vigliotti's base-running in the 10th to end the marathon.

HURON TOWNSHIP — Airport Community spotted neighboring Huron Township 11 runs in the second inning here Monday and came on to score a thrilling, 13-11 victory.

Couch Bill Leech's Jets posted their sixth victory in nine starts by piling home six runs in the final frame.

Ron Hatcher was Airport's starting pitcher and retired the first three men he faced. It was a different story in the second stanza, however.
