Vigliotti Tops Breitner in Falcon-Jet Duel

Skinner's Single Notches 1-0 Win

Jerry Skinner, a sophomore outfielder who is hitting close to .500 despite an unorthodox swing, punched a bases-loaded single into center field Tuesday on Cairns Field to settle a brilliant pitching duel between Catholic Central's Dick Vigliotti and Airport Community's Ron Breitner. The blow scored Vigliotti from third base and

gave the Falcons their fourth straight Southeastern Michigan Conference win, 1-0.

The combination of Vigliotti, Skinner and a fine throw by Ron Driessche in the bottom of the seventh inning ended a six-game winning streak for Coach Bill Leech's Jets. Three of them were league triumphs.

Off to a slow start before Tuesday's performance, Vigliotti stattered two hits and fanned 10 in the clutch effort. Airport had only one runner as far as third base, two others cut down trying to make it.

Goethe Starts Rally

Breitner matched Central's southpaw almost pitch for pitch until the disastrous seventh. He fashioned nine strikeouts and allowed only three safeties in all.

Most of the game was played in the seventh inning. Before that it was a repetition of one of the clubs getting a man on, bunting him to second base and watching him die there.

Harold (Spook) Goethe, lanky Falcon first cacker, drew Breitner's fourth base on balls to open the final frame and Vigliotti forced him at second.

Hoog Relieves

Catcher Norman Bonk, one of four sophomores in the starting lineup, followed with a crisp bouncer to the right of first baseman Roger Hoog. He knocked the ball down but it rolled into short right field, Vigliotti racing to third.

Jimmy Godfroy worked Breitner for his fifth pass and Skinner belted a waist high fast ball over Breitner's head into short center. Coach Leech called on Hoog at this point and he retired the last two batters in order.

Since Airport was the home team, — using Cairns Field only because the Carleton diamond is wet — the Jets had their coats coming and Hoog lit the fire with a one-out walk.

Steal Is Stopped

Here Coach Leech put all his eggs in one basket and flashed Hoog the steal sign. He never had a chance. Driessche's perfect throw allowing Barry Marshall to have the ball waiting for Hoog.

It was a decisive play because Ray Doede followed with a solid single to right-center and he took second when Godfroy fumbled the hit. A passed ball put Doede on third before Vigliotti turned on the heat to fan Jerry Tilley.

Ron Breitner Pitches Jets to 10-1 Victory

LAMBERTVILLE — Ron Breitner, fast-balling Airport Community righthander, struck out 16 Bedford Public batters here Thursday as Coach Bill Leech's potent Jets blasted the Mules, 10-1.

The Southeastern Michigan Conference game originally was scheduled for the Carleton diamond but standing water there forced the transfer. At that, part of the contest was played in a drizzle and footing was slippery along the basepaths.

Bedford hurler Gary Douge contributed six walks and five wild pitches to the Jet cause and his mates committed six errors as the winners produced only three unearned runs.

Airport, which now has an 8-1 record, scored all of its tallies in the first three innings, six in a big third frame that featured two-run hits by John Jabe and Ray Doede.

The losers managed only one hit off Breitner—a fifth inning single by Jim Estes—but nine bases on balls kept him in trouble. Bedford scored its lone run in the

seventh stanza on three walks and Jabe's wild throw.

Central Blasts Jets, 6-1 For Outright SMC Title

Monroe Catholic Central left no doubt as to its baseball superiority over Airport Community Friday.

Coach Jack Castiglione's Falcons splattered eight hits, six of them extra-base blows, around the confines of Calras Field in handing the Jets a decisive 6-1 setback. It gave the parochials a final 8-0 record in the Southeastern Michigan Conference, the first undefeated champion the league has had.
